- + **30 June 2024 for further consideration, providing we have places on the course you've applied for.**
- + **16 October 2023 for all applications to study medicine and dentistry.**

Contextual offers

If you meet our Access+ criteria, you could get what's called a contextual offer. This means your application will be given additional consideration. You may also be made a lower offer.

Applications are considered on a case-by-case basis. That means we look at your academic achievements, personal situation and your potential to succeed.



You might be eligible if you:

- + live in an area with a low rate of participation in higher education;
- + are a care leaver;
- + are care experienced;
- + are estranged from family;
- + are a carer;
- + are a forced migrant;
- + have parenting responsibilities;
- + are entitled to free school meals.

Being an Access+ offer holder entitles you to support from a dedicated team. You can get help with the skills you'll need to transition to university and access financial support.




How long will you study for?

- + 4 years – Degrees beginning with M (such as MComp, MEng, MBiolSci) take you to masters level.
- + 3 years – Bachelors degrees (BA, BEng, BSc and others).
- + 1 year – A foundation year, placement year or year abroad usually adds another year to whichever course you choose.

What is a combined course?

- + If the course has 'and' in the title the split between the two subjects is roughly 50/50.
- + If the course has 'with' in the title there is more emphasis on the first subject.





Entry requirements

A quick look at the basics

This prospectus lists entry requirements for A Levels, BTECs and the International Baccalaureate (IB).

Entry qualifications

We welcome applications from students studying a range of UK, European and international qualifications.

- + **If you're taking A Levels, we usually need a minimum of three subjects.**
- + **We accept a range of vocational qualifications, such as BTECs, Cambridge Technicals and T Levels.**
- + **Some courses require prior study and knowledge of specific subjects.**
- + **Contextual offers available for A Levels and other relevant qualifications.**
- + **Alternative offers may be available for Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), Core Maths or Further Maths.**
- + **We require English Language GCSE grade 4/C or above.**
- + **Some courses require higher levels of achievement in English Language, or achievement in other GCSEs (for example GCSE Mathematics).**
- + **If English isn't your first language, we accept a number of tests and qualifications, including IELTS.**


